Project end : 14 December 2015

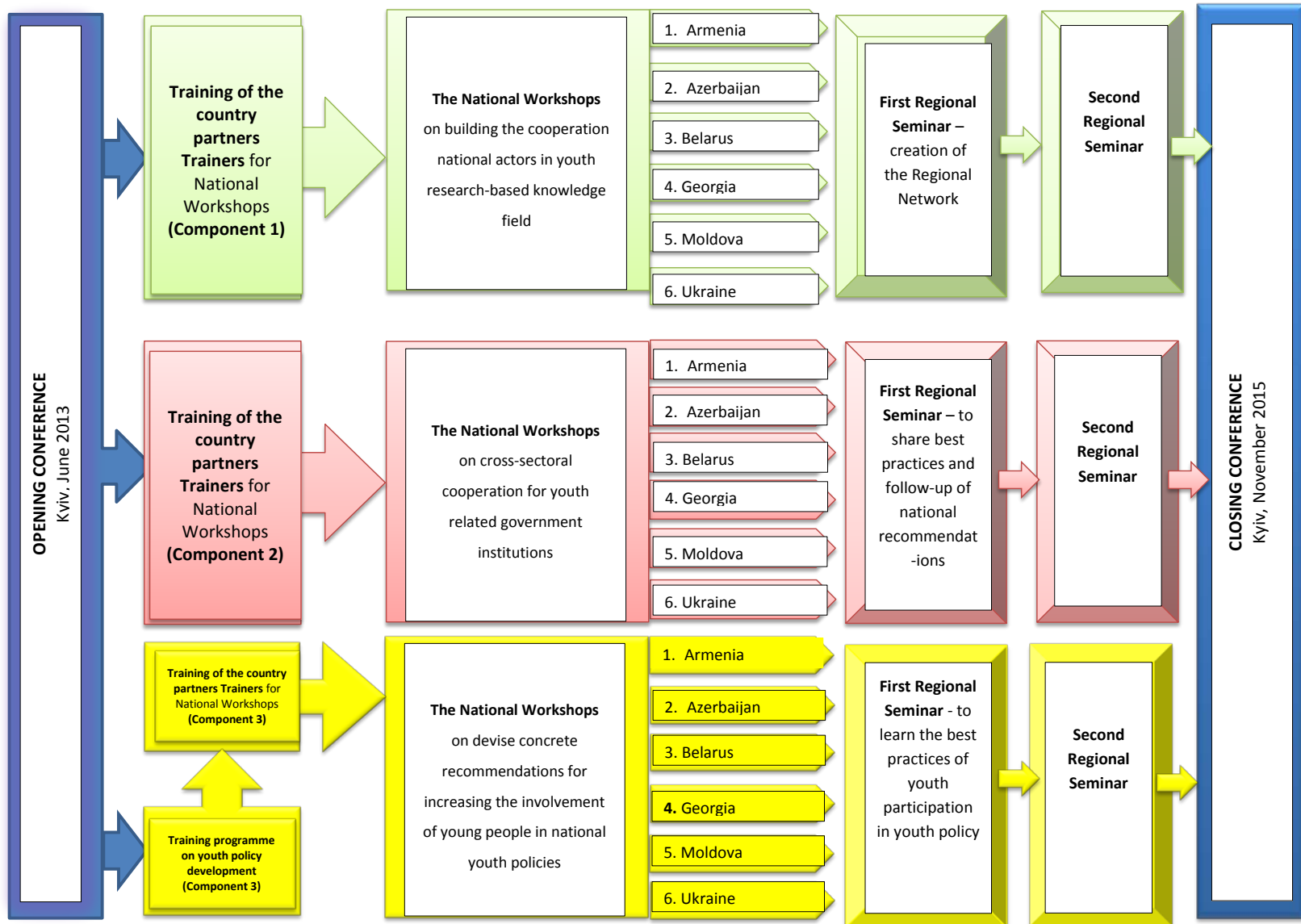
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Components

- 1. Supporting the development of a more comprehensive evidence base for national youth policy**
- 2. Facilitating the mainstreaming of youth issues across relevant policy spheres and fostering a cross-sector approach responding to youth needs**
- 3. Supporting capacity development of government and civil society actors in the youth sector to enhance stakeholder involvement**
- 4. Providing visibility and dissemination activities about all initiatives related to developments in the youth sphere**

- 9 within the framework of Component 2
- 10 within the framework of Component 3
- 1 within the framework of Component 4
- 10 additional activities
- 20 Project related and third sides events

- 58 events/activities in total

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Core Results/Outputs

- 21 people passed e-Learning Modules 1,2 and 3;
- White Book contains more than 100 recommendations;
- Compendium consists of:
 - approx. 250 Stakeholders,
 - approx. 250 books, brochures, publications
 - approx. 40 links to sources on youth policy
- Glossary on approx. 110 Terms on Youth Policy
